FDOT'S AVIATION PLANNING RESPONSIBILITIES

FDOT Aviation Office supports aviation planning efforts through...

Development of:

- Florida Aviation System Plan (FASP)
- Continuing Florida Aviation System Planning Process (CFASPP)
- Programs and studies

Review of:

- Airport Master Plans (AMPs)
- Airport Layout Plans (ALPs)

FDOT'S AVIATION PLANNING RESPONSIBILITIES

Florida's aviation facilities include (2023):

- 128 public use airports (106 publicly-owned, 22 privately-owned)
- 25 military facilities
- ~550 private use facilities

Florida Airport System (2023): The 106 public use, publicly-owned airports that are included in the Florida Aviation System Plan (FASP)

- All 106 of the public use, publicly-owned airports are eligible for state funding (includes Destin-Ft. Walton Beach)
- Of these, only the airports that meet FAA NPIAS designation criteria are eligible for federal funding (99)
